CA Dream Act

Where does it apply?

California ONLY

Nationwide

What it allows?

Who sees your information?

allows undocumented students who meet the AB 540 requirements* to apply for in-state tuition, state-administered financial aid, and apply and receive private scholarships

*Graduate from a California high school or have attained the equivalent, GED-- certified by the State of California; attend a CA High School for 3 years or more (no need to be consecutive); attend a CA accredited post-secondary institution


*The Federal Government does not have any access to the

information provided in the CA Dream Act application.

allows people who came to the United States as children and meet several guidelines may request consideration of deferred action for a period of two years, subject to renewal

allows those who are eligible to have work authorization

allows recipients to apply for a driver's license



*The State Government may know that you are a DACA recipient once you apply for special programs.

Note: A person can be eligible for both CA Dream Act and DACA, or just either one.
