CA Dream Act

DACA

Where does it apply?

California ONLY

Nationwide

What it allows?

- allows undocumented students who meet the AB 540 requirements* to apply for in-state tuition, state-administered financial aid, and apply and receive private scholarships
 - *Graduate from a California high school or have attained the equivalent, GED-- certified by the State of California; attend a CA High School for 3 years or more (no need to be consecutive); attend a CA accredited post-secondary institution
- allows people who came to the United States as children and meet several guidelines may request consideration of deferred action for a period of two years, subject to renewal
- allows those who are eligible to have work authorization
- allows recipients to apply for a driver's license

*The Federal Government does not have any access to the information provided in the CA Dream Act application.





*The State Government may know that you are a DACA recipient once you apply for special programs.

Note: A person can be eligible for both CA Dream Act and DACA, or just either one.
